
Fruit description

A round plum, of regular shape, slightly flattened. The skin color is red -purple, with very small yellow spots, with a beautiful waxy coat. The fruit skin is shiny, the stone is small and semi clingstone. The fruit flesh is oranged yellow, with a small red lining under the skin. The firmness is excellent, optimal eating qualities are reached at a level of 70 (DUROFEL 10). Underneath the crunchy skin, the flesh is juicy and creamy. The fruit is sweet (18% Brix), flavoursome, aromatic. The acitidy found under the skin enhances the aromas. It is an explosion of flavours. The eating quality is excellent.

Production

In good production conditions, the yield can reach 25 T/Ha.

The dominant fruit size is 50-55 mm with an average fruit weight of 80 g.

Thinning: important


(f)3 Tree

Habit: spreading, type III

Vigor : very good

Wood qualities: good flexible

 Characteristics: the tree is branched over its entire height. Habit is open, spreading. Souple wood, allowing the branches to bend flexibly.



 Orchard layout: this variety behaves very well when managed as a modern hedge row. Planting distance: 4 m x 1.7 m or 4.5 m x 1.7 m.

 Trees development: encourage the growth of the leader by pruning the lateral apical shoots. Prune the branches which compete with the establishment of the leader. Attach the fruit bearing branches which are not naturally properly positionned. Cut back the excessive fruiting branches.
